FUNDAMENTALS OF CHINESE CHARACTERS 汉字基础

This book acknowledges that the writing system of the Chinese language is drastically different from that of a language using an alphabet such as English. It adopts a new approach to learning Chinese characters, making it possible for those students who have no knowledge of Chinese writing system to learn to recognize and write Chinese characters without waiting to learn to speak Chinese first. The book elucidates the connections between the shapes and meanings of basic Chinese characters, teaching students to recognize and write characters systematically. If students can already speak some standard Chinese, the book has rhymes, written with the basic characters covered in the book, to help these students to establish the link between the shapes and pronunciations of these characters. With the knowledge and skills learned from using

this book, students are expected to continue to learn Chinese with ease and confidence.
